TOUR ITINERARY:

Saturday March 15 / DAY 1 - CAIRO

- Arrive in Cairo and settle into the hotel.

Sunday March 16 / DAY 2 - CAIRO

- Spend the morning viewing the Egyptian Museum's famous collection of King Tutankhamen as well as the treasures from the Old Kingdom, Middle Kingdom, and New Kingdom. Visit the Museum of Civilizations where all the royal mummies are on display including the well-preserved mummy of Ramses II.
- Sunset private cocktail on small boat on the Nile while cruising around Cairo.

Thursday March 20 / DAY 6 - NILE CRUISE

- In the morning, Sail to Kom Ombo. Visit on the way the temple of Kom Ombo dedicated to Sobek the Crocodile god and Hours the falcon god. Continue sailing to Edfu. After Lunch visit to the Temple of Horus, this temple was dedicated to the union of Hathor and Horus. Overnight at Esna.

Nile Cruise (B, L, D)

Friday March 21 / DAY 7 - NILE CRUISE/LUXOR

- Early morning sailing to the City of Luxor.
- Visit the West Bank of Luxor, including the Tomb of King Tut and Ramses VI in the Valley of the Kings.
- Visit the Temple of Hatshepsut.
- After lunch visit the Tomb of Nefertari in the Valley of the Queens.

Saturday March 22 / DAY 8 - LUXOR/CAIRO

- Visit the Temple of Karnak and the Temple of Luxor. Visit the avenue of the Sphinx that connects the two temples together. Early evening flight to Cairo.

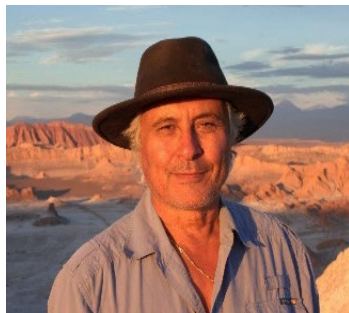

was also the honored recipient of the Philip and Eugenia Cho Award for Outstanding Scholarship in Asian Studies in 2007 for book "The Neolithic of Southeast China" (Cambria Press, 2007).

RESERVATION AND CANCELLATION POLICIES

Reservation and Payment

A deposit of \$1000 per person will be required at the time of booking. Final payment will be due 60 days prior the departure. It is the responsibility of the traveler (or his agent) to determine that final payment reaches the Tour Operator on time. Bookings made within 60 days of departure date, full and final payment will be due immediately upon booking. No booking will be considered until the Tour Operator receives final deposit.

Cancellation and Refunds

Cancellations must be received by the Tour Operator in writing within 60 days of travel date. Cancellations received more than 60 days prior to departure will have a penalty of \$500 per person; those received between 46 and 31 days will have a penalty of 50% per person; those received between 30 and 15 days will have a penalty of 75% per person. Cancellations received 14 days or less before departure or "no shows" will receive no refund. No refund will be made for transfers, city tours or any other services (including meals, accommodations, or transportation) voluntarily not taken.

While Joy Travel welcomes all travelers on our tours, the excursions are fast paced and can be physically demanding. Many countries do not maintain the same strict standards for disabled access, and as such Joy Travel cannot guarantee accessibility for wheelchairs, walkers, and other special aids at hotels, restaurants, museums and other attractions.
